Clause 28(5b) of the Club's Constitution: Any member who is entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting, but unable to attend shall be entitled to apply to the Secretary for a postal vote. Application for a postal vote must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary fourteen days prior to the Annual General Meeting. Within seven days the Secretary in the presence of the President and one other Committee member appointed by the Committee will forward an initialled ballot paper to each applicant and record their name. Members to whom ballot papers are posted will under no circumstances be given a second ballot paper. Completed ballot papers are to be returned to the Returning Officer or the Secretary in envelopes endorsed, "Ballot Papers." These envelopes shall be handed (unopened) to the Returning Officer officiating at the poll. Clause 30(2)(a) of the Club's Constitution: Every member who was a financial member of the Club for not less than three months of the financial year preceding the Annual General Meeting and is currently a financial member shall be entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting and shall be eligible to nominate or be nominated as an Office Bearer or member of the Committee. A member may be nominated for and hold more than one position on the Committee clause 14(3) of the Club's Constitution:- Notice of an annual general meeting and the form of nomination of Committee of Management shall be deemed to have been given to each member if they are published in, or enclosed with, the Club's newsletter or journal or such other publication as the Club may circulate to its members provided that such publication is dispatched to each member not less than thirty days prior to the date of the annual general meeting or if they are served upon him personally not less than twenty-eight days prior to the date of that meeting or if they are sent through the post not less than thirty days prior to the meeting addressed to each member at the address shown in the Register of Members.

# LIFE MEMBER NOMINATIONS

The Committee has reviewed the Life Membership nominations received by **30/06/2026** and wish to advise that the following nominations have fulfilled the criteria as stated in the Club By-Laws.

## LIFE MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

- a) (i) Minimum of ten years fully paid consecutive membership, or
  - (ii) Ten years fully paid membership, with a lapse of not more than one year.
  - b) During membership period, nominee must have given at least seven years of significant service to the membership of the Club.
  - c) Nominations must be made in writing by a financial member of the Club.
  - d) The Nominee must include a full resume stating full details of nominee's eligibility to enable verification by the Committee. Failure to provide a detailed resume will result in the nomination being rejected
  - e) The nominee must be a financial member of the Club at the time of nomination and ratification.
  - f) Nominations for Life Membership to be received by the Committee no later than 30th June of each year.
  - g) The Committee of the Club will verify or reject the nomination, on the stated criteria.
  - h) If the nomination is rejected the Committee will notify the nominator in writing stating the reasons for the rejection.
  - i) Verified nominees for Life Membership will be printed in the July newsletter each year.
  - j) Any objections to proposed Life Members printed in the July newsletter, must be made in writing to the Committee and be received before the August Committee meeting prior to the Club's Annual General Meeting. The submission must contain details as to why the verification of the nomination should be rejected under the criteria to enable the committee to reconvene and investigate.
- Final acceptance of Life Members will be ratified at the Club's Annual General Meeting held each year by a minimum of 75% of the members in attendance voting in favour of the nomination.

As stated in Club By-Law 1 (i), these nominations are now printed in the **July 2026 Newsletter**.

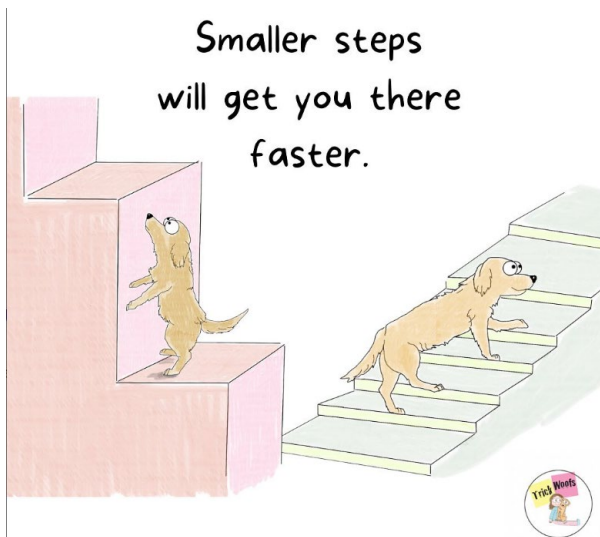

# Training: Socialising your dog

## Socializing Your Dog

...refers to providing him with **POSITIVE** experiences with **NEW THINGS**.  
The best way to make sure your dog has great experiences is to include things he loves (like food or toys)



### Remember: **EXPOSURE** alone isn't socialization!

If your dog isn't having a great time, you could do more harm than good. Dogs don't just "get over" issues by themselves, so if your dog is shy, worried, or overly excited, leave the situation and work with a professional who can help both of you. If your dog is having a blast and is happy and comfortable, you're doing a great job of socializing him!

## Does My Dog Love Other Dogs?

**Just like people, dogs have different levels of tolerance for other dogs.**

As a dog matures, he or she will often quite naturally become less social and tolerant. There are many developmental changes that happen between sexual and social maturity, and most dogs will continue to display these changes until two to three years of age. Proper facilitation of dog-dog introductions and friendships can change your dog's sociability for the better over time, and bad experiences can quickly make things worse. Good leadership and direction is important to set your dog up for success with their species.



### DOG SOCIAL

I generally LOVE all dogs, even the ones who get in my face and do rude, annoying stuff. I am either a PUPPY or a VERY SOCIAL ADULT.

*\*Most puppies start here*



### DOG TOLERANT

I get along with most dogs. I am generally tolerant of rude behavior, and stay pretty calm on leash. I'm cool and relaxed, and have good communication skills.



### DOG SELECTIVE

I have dog friends but am picky about new dogs. Seeing unfamiliar dogs when I am on leash is really stressful. I don't cope well with some types of dogs or styles of interaction. I need human supervision, positive guidance, and proper introductions.



### DOG AGGRESSIVE

NOPE. Not into other dogs. If I have to select 1 or 2 dog friends, I am super sensitive around them too, and may act like a jerk when triggered. I need extra management and patience from my humans, whom I love more than dogs!

**PUPPY CLASS All Exercises as per Class 1 – plus retrieving, puppy play and socialisation.**

**CLASS 1 All exercises on Loose Lead.**

Heel on lead with right / left turn and right / left about turn.  
 Sit (Voice and lead/manually sit)  
 Drop (from sit position)  
 Stand – alongside handler.  
 Recall (on lead, 4 metres) Progressing to handler returning around dog.  
 Sit-Stay (10 seconds) Progressing to handler returning around dog.

**CLASS 2 All Class 1 exercises plus:**

Heel on lead, plus all turns  
 Slow pace  
 Dog Introduction  
 Stand Stay (on lead)  
 Recall (on lead - Handler returns around dog)  
 Sit Stay (30 seconds)  
 Drop Stay (30 seconds - Handler returns around dog)

**CLASS 3 All Class 1 & 2 exercises plus:**

Drop (whilst heeling)  
 Figure of Eight  
 Fast Pace  
 Stand for Examination (Introduce lightly running hand over back & head). Recall Off Lead (maximum of 10 metres – lead up on lead)  
 Finish on Lead  
 Sit Stay (approx. 3 metres – 60 seconds with lead on the ground)  
 Drop Stay (approx. 3 metres – 60 seconds with lead on the ground)

**CLASS 4 (CCD) All Class 1, 2 & 3 exercises plus:**

Heeling on Lead  
 Introduction to off lead heeling.  
 Stand for Examination (on lead)  
 Recall at least 12 metres – no lead up or finish)  
 Change of Position Exercise – Drop in front of handler / lead on / return. Sit Stay (1 minute – approx.5 metres off lead)  
 Drop Stay (2 minutes – approx.5 metres off lead)  
 Introduction to Dumbbell / Retrieve Dumbbell Exercise. Introduction to Broad Jump.

All ANKC Novice Class Exercises including both optional exercises.  
 All Stays with Distractions

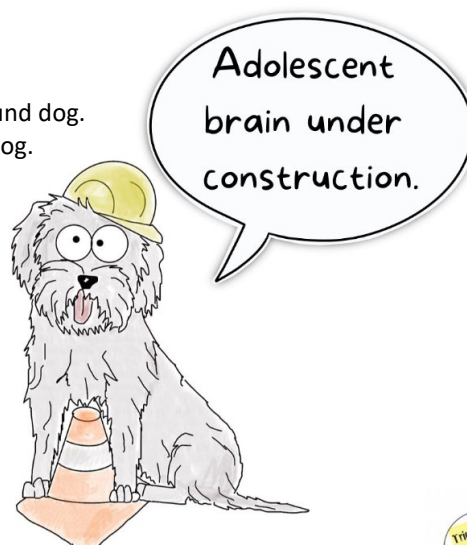
